

Request for Tender for Project Lead

Title of Report: Good Practice Guidelines for Working with the Traveller Community

Project Description

In light of the high rates of mental health difficulties, suicidality, and disability within the Traveller community, the PSI are seeking to develop Good Practice Guidelines to support members to better understand, engage with, and support members of the Traveller community in their clinical and research work. The PSI are recruiting a Project Lead who will work closely with both the PSI project steering team and representatives of the Traveller community.

Job Description

Qualifications:

- Educational Background: A degree in Psychology, Social Sciences, Anthropology, Public Health, or related field. A Master's degree is preferred.
- Experience: Proven experience in conducting primary research and developing practice guidelines, preferably with marginalized or minority communities.
- Skills:
 - Strong analytical and synthesis skills.
 - Excellent written and verbal communication skills.
 - Ability to work independently and collaboratively.
 - Cultural sensitivity and understanding of the Traveller community.

Key Responsibilities:

- Collect, review, and synthesize existing research (ensuring inclusion of reports conducted out by the community) on the mental health related needs of the Traveller community, including culturally sensitive practices and health disparities
- Build respectful, collaborative relationships with members of the Traveller community to ensure all work reflects their lived experiences, cultural identity, and specific mental health needs.
- Conduct a comprehensive review and synthesis of existing research on the mental health
 of the Traveller community, including reports and studies led by or in partnership with the
 community.
- Develop culturally sensitive, evidence-informed practice guidelines to support psychologists and researchers working with the Traveller community.

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- Co-develop resources and guidance in partnership with Traveller representatives and relevant community organisations, ensuring authenticity and trust are maintained throughout the process.
- Produce a high-quality, standalone report tailored specifically for psychologists, clearly outlining culturally responsive approaches and practical recommendations.
- Translate complex research findings into accessible, actionable guidance for PSI members and the broader psychological community.
- Design and deliver a training session or workshop at the 2026 PSI Conference, focused on culturally competent engagement and research with the Traveller community.
- Engage with both PSI members and non-members to foster inclusive dialogue around culturally responsive psychological practice.
- Collaborate with stakeholders across the mental health and community sectors to validate findings and ensure the relevance of developed resources.
- Contribute to improving the cultural competence of the psychology profession in Ireland by aligning all work with PSI's commitment to equity, inclusion, and human rights.

PSI is an equal opportunities organisation, and especially welcome applications from members of the Traveller community.

Renumeration will be according to an agreed payment schedule and in line with the agreed Researcher Salary pay scale at the grade of Research Assistant.
